MAGISTRATE ANN MCGARVIE, GEELONG LAW COURTS

Magistrate McGarvie commenced studying law at university at the age of 26. After completing her law degree in 1992, she worked for Slater & Gordon as an articled clerk and then as a solicitor in the personal injury area.

In 1996, she went to the bar and appeared as a barrister in the Magistrates Court in criminal, civil and victims of crime assistance matters. She also appeared in VCAT in personal injury related matters and in the Children's Court.

In addition to her work as a barrister she lectured in Health Services Law at Monash University.

In 2000, she commenced working with the Legal Ombudsman, investigating professional misconduct allegations against solicitors and barristers. In 2002, she moved to the Office of Public Prosecutions where she worked as a circuit solicitor.

In 2004, she was appointed to VCAT, sitting in the Residential Tenancies, Civil Claims and Guardianship and Administration lists. She was appointed a magistrate in 2010 and has been working at the Geelong Law Courts since that time.
