Anna Brown has led much of the Centre's work on LGBTI rights, police accountability, protester rights, and equality law reform. Her work has included strategic litigation to advance marriage equality; recognise sex and gender diversity, and efforts to strengthen protection of political expression and assembly. Major law reform projects include securing federal LGBTI discrimination protections and ongoing work to expunge historical convictions for gay sex offences in various states in Australia.



Lee Carnie joined the HRLC as part of the LGBTI Rights Unit. Lee is passionate about improving practical access to human rights for the LGBTI community. Lee has experience engaging in policy and law reform on the board of the Victorian Gay & Lesbian Rights Lobby, assisting young LGBTI victims of crime to receive compensation at Youthlaw and volunteering at the {also} foundation. As an outreach lawyer at Youthlaw, Lee also specialised in frontline advocacy for young people experiencing homelessness, substance abuse and mental health issues.
