

Lesbia Harford is a poet, novelist, law student, articled clerk and political activist and a pioneer of women – particularly in the legal profession.

Born Melbourne in 1891, at around the time of world war, suffrage, the challenging of religious ideals and social upheaval, Lesbia embraced workers' rights and developed a lyric writing style when authoring the three notebooks of poems. These poems were found after her early death in 1927.

Although forgotten for decades, Lesbia Harford is now seen as one of the first truly modern and urban figures in Australian poetry



Celeste Liddle is an Arrernte woman, an opinion writer, a trade unionist and public speaker.

Currently serving as the National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Organiser of the National Tertiary Education Union, Celeste started her blog "Rantings of an Aboriginal Feminist" in June 2012.

Celeste's writing has been published by Daily Life and various other publications.

Celeste writes and speaks tough topics in concise and accessible ways. Mixing anecdote and humour, Celeste takes her lead from many amazing Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander thinkers who have inspired her along the way.
