She is the author of eight books, including the classic Damned Whores and God's Police, first published in 1975. Anne launched her own series - Anne Summers Conversations - with an event featuring former Prime Minister Julia Gillard in front of a packed Sydney Opera House in 2013. Anne was a leader of the generation and the movement that changed Australia for women.



Emma Alberici is the ABC's Chief Economics Correspondent and one of Australia's most highly regarded journalists. She moved to the ABC in 2002 to present Business Breakfast. Since then she has been the 7.30 Report's Finance Editor and a senior reporter. In 2008, Emma relocated to the UK where she spent four years as the Europe Correspondent for the ABC. With three children under three, Emma became the first Australian mother to be a foreign correspondent. The daughter of a greengrocer, born and raised in Melbourne by migrant Italian parents, Emma has been a finalist three times in the Walkley Awards for journalistic excellence.
