

THE VALUE OF VALUES-BASED CONTRACTS with guest speaker Kim Wright



Please join Victorian Women Lawyers for an introduction to values-based contracts by Kim Wright, advocate for transformative approaches to the law.

Values-based contracts are designed to reflect the mission, vision and values of the contracting parties. Also known as 'conscious' contracts, they are tools for use to help companies and organisations improve their relationships with the stakeholders they affect, rather than as adversarial instruments.

In her talk, Kim will introduce us to the potential of values-based contracts, and explain how lawyers can assist companies and organisations to align their legal documents with their values to create long-term sustainable relationships. There will then be the opportunity to ask Kim questions about values-based contracts and her career in Integrative Law.

Kim Wright is a US-based lawyer whose career has focused on humanistic, relational approaches in law. From collaborative divorce practice to restorative justice and values-based contracts, she has practiced, pioneered and promoted innovative models and ideas in the area of 'Integrative Law'. Kim has also authored two books on related subjects, which were published by the American Bar Association. Kim travels extensively to offer training and consulting to a range of companies and organisations. Developing values-based legal documents and policies is a particular focus in these sessions.
