EMMA HEUSTON

In 2011, Emma was on the traditional corporate lawyer path working at a boutique Sydney law firm. But a near death experience changed her views on work/ life balance and made her realise that life is too short not to follow your dreams.

At 13 weeks pregnant, Emma was given a common anti-nausea drug in hospital and had a sudden cardiac arrest. Both Emma and her baby boy (who is now 8) survived but it put things into perspective for Emma.

In 2013, Emma moved her young family to far Northern New South Wales where she worked remotely as a Partner in a NewLaw firm for a number of years.

In 2018, Emma wrote the work from home bible, "The Tracksuit Economy: how to work productively and effectively from home" and was also named as "Thought leader of the Year" in 2018 by Lawyers Weekly at the Women in Law Awards for her work in the remote work space in the law.

Lauren Cassimatis, Director of Gallant Law is known as one of Victoria's leading criminal lawyers and an Accredited Specialist in Criminal Law.
