Louise is the Chief Executive Officer of Victoria Legal Aid, the Chair of National Legal Aid, the Victorian Assisted Reproductive Treatment Authority, the Western Metropolitan Partnership, and the Ministerial Development Advisory Panel.

Louise is also an Adjunct Professor at Victoria University. Prior to these appointments, Louise was the Chief Executive Officer of the Victorian Responsible Gambling Foundation and she spent three years as Deputy CEO at the National Disability Insurance Agency implementing the NDIS.
