## **Justice Michael Sifris**

His Honour is the first South African Judge to sit on the Victorian Supreme Court and Court of Appeal. After emigrating to Australia in 1986 and requalifying, his Honour signed the Bar Roll in 1989. His Honour established his practice in banking and securities law and corporate insolvency during his more than 21 years at the Bar. His Honour was appointed a Judge of the Trial Division of the Supreme Court in 2010, and in 2020 as a Judge of the Court of Appeal. His Honour is highly regarded as an expert in corporate insolvency law.

Neena has spent the last 15 years advising on projects and transactions in the energy and infrastructure sectors, woking on matters in the UK, Europe, Africa, the Middle East and Australia.

Daniel went on to study law and commerce at Flinders University, gaining a broad range of experience whilst completing his studies. Daniel is a strong advocate for refugees and other marginalised groups, with strong community involvement and commitment to pro-bono work.
